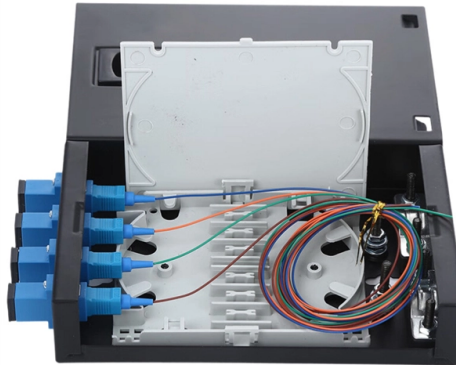


Should galvanized cable trays be cross-connected

10 The connectors between metal cable trays should be directly crimped with at least two sets of galvanized steel bolts with anti loosening gaskets to achieve conductive connection, or insulated multi strand copper wires with crimped tinned copper connectors should be used for. 10. 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The choice of method should be discussed with a local inspector. The best decision may be to extend only the cables, creating a discontinuity in the cable tray.
