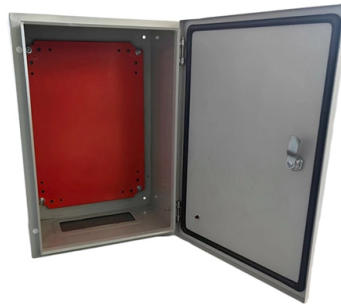


Standard for Residential Elevator Distribution Boxes



AI Overview

A residential elevator distribution box typically uses a dedicated panelboard with drawout or fixed-mounted MCCBs rated for 240–600 Vac, with main and feeder breakers sized according to elevator load and code requirements.

Components
Panelboard Type: Residential elevators commonly use a drawout MCCB Pow-R-Line 4DX panelboard or similar, which allows mechanical insertion and removal of breakers for maintenance and safety. Both two- and three-pole breakers are used depending on the elevator motor and control requirements. Voltage and Current Ratings: Standard residential elevator panels are rated for 240 Vac, with some models supporting 480 Vac or 600 Vac. Breaker ratings typically range from 20 A to 600 A, with the main breaker sized according to the elevator's full-load current.

Breaker Arrangement:
Main breaker: Provides overall protection for the elevator circuit. For ratings above 600 A, a fixed-mounted bolt-on design is used; for 600 A and below, either drawout or fixed-mounted breakers are acceptable.
Feeder breakers: Horizontally mounted in a group-mounted manner, these supply power to the elevator motor, control circuits, and auxiliary systems. Drawout cassettes allow easy removal and replacement.

Safety Features: UL 50 Listed boxes and trims with ANSI-61 light gray paint for durability and visibility. Deadfront covers to prevent accidental contact with live components. Short-circuit ratings are determined by the lowest-rated overcurrent device in the panel, ensuring coordinated protection.

Installation Considerations: The distribution box should be dedicated to the elevator to prevent overloading and ensure compliance with ASME A17.1/CSA B44 safety codes.

Proper grounding and bonding are required, and the panel should be located in an accessible area for maintenance. Coordination with the elevator manufacturer is recommended.
