Methods of Non-Intrusive Tapping Optical Splitters: These devices divert a small percentage of the light to a monitoring port while the majority continues along the live network. This allows full-duplex monitoring without disrupting traffic. Bend Taps: By slightly bending the fiber, a small amount of light leaks out, which can be detected by a fiber identifier or similar device. This method works only on standard fibers, not bend-insensitive types. Test Access Points (TAPs): Installed inline, TAPs provide a passive copy of the traffic for analysis. They are invisible to the network and do not require power or configuration. Detection and Security Fiber networks can detect unauthorized taps by monitoring attenuation or drops in signal power. Even a few tenths of a decibel drop can indicate a tap. To prevent eavesdropping, encryption and time-division multiplexing techniques are recommended, making intercepted data difficult to interpret.
