

Welding is not permitted on cable trays



Overview

Due to their exposure to the open air because of the cable trays, the wires contained within need a very durable outer covering. The regulations dictate that the cables must either be Type TC (also known as Tray Rated) or must be metal-armored (Type MC). A generic guideline provided by The Cable Tray Institute indicates that cable trays should not be filled in excess of 40-50% of the inside area of the tray or of the maximum weight based on the cable tray specifications. The NEC provides specific and more detailed requirements for cable tray fill. • Ladder cable tray cannot pipe hazardous or explosive gases from one area to another as happens with conduit systems. A rung spacing of 6 to 9 inches (150 to 230 mm) is preferable when the cable tray is used for instrumentation and control applications that require. (B) Welding cables installed in dedicated cable trays; (C) Single conductors used as equipment grounding conductors; these conductors, which may be insulated, covered, or bare, shall be No.

If visual observation reveals a cable tray that is completely full and/or over-flowing with cables, chances are that the cable tray is in violation of both the National Electrical Code and OSHA requirements.

Dedicated cable tray: This option suggests a specific tray designed solely for the purpose of carrying welding cable, which is a suitable choice since it ensures that the cable is not mixed with other types

For these installations, the cable manufacturer's recommended minimum bending radii for the specific cables must not be violated. If the rung spacing is too close,

(1) Single-Conductor Cables and Single Insulated Conductors

When using 1/0 to 4/0 AWG cables in ladder trays, the rung spacing must not exceed 225 mm (9 inches). Additionally, welding cables must adhere to Article 630, Part IV regulations.

In industrial establishments where conditions of maintenance and supervision assure that only qualified persons will service the installed cable tray system, the following cables may also be installed in

29 CFR 1910.305 -

(3) Uses not permitted. Fixture wires may not be used as branch-circuit conductors except as permitted for Class 1 power limited circuits and for fire alarm circuits.

Welding Cable & Conductors in Cable Tray

The MC cables feeding the welding receptacles are not welding cables and the reference to Part IV of Article 630 is incorrect. These are just branch circuit conductors installed in a cable tray
