- MT-RJ / MPO:** Multi-fiber connectors for high-density applications.

- Single-fiber (simplex):** Most common, used for standard connections.
- Multi-fiber:** 2, 4, 6, 12, 24, 48, or 72 fibers, often in ribbon format for high-density splicing in ODFs or data centers.

Construction and Special Features

- Color-coded jackets:** Follow TIA/EIA-598-A standards for easy identification.
- Armored or waterproof pigtails:** Provide durability, tensile strength, and moisture resistance for harsh environments.
- Mechanical vs. fusion splicing:** Bare fiber ends are designed for either method, with fusion splicing offering lower loss and stronger joints.
