

What protection should be used after splicing a four-core pigtail



Overview

Slide a matching heat shrink protection sleeve over the splice point. The sleeve can then be heated in a heating oven or using a heat clamp to allow the sleeve to shrink evenly, creating a mechanical seal and protection against moisture. Once fibers are spliced, they need to be protected. For protection against the outside plant environment and damage, splices require placement in a protective enclosure, usually called a splice closure. These protective devices help to protect fiber strands from damage caused by physical stress, environmental factors, and other external factors that can. Always clean the fiber ends before splicing, using specialized cleaning tools like fiber wipes and isopropyl alcohol. Without proper splicing and closure protection, networks face: signal degradation and increased attenuation—reducing transmission quality and speed.
