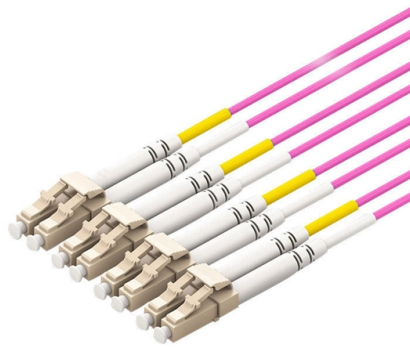


What size distribution box should be selected for the circuit
