- Fiber network adapters:** Enable direct fiber connections to computers or servers, supporting fiber-to-the-desktop (FTTD) setups.
- Optical transceivers (SFP/SFP+/QSFP):** Pluggable modules that connect fiber cables to switches, routers, or servers, often inserted into ports on the panel or connected devices.
